


December 8, 2010 —SVARW Monthly Meeting

AMNESTY BILL IN THE LAME DUCK SESSION

Senator Harry Reid and Rep. Nancy Pelosi are planning to have a "lame duck" session of Congress in mid November. Sen. Robert Menendez introduced S. 3932, Comprehensive Immigration Act of 2010, a massive amnesty bill, hoping it would pass during this time. This is an 874 page bill that pre-empts all state and local laws affecting immigration and permits people to bring in same-sex partners. The bill also requires free legal services for illegal aliens for civil proceedings, and creates yet another executive agency to decide how many foreign workers to admit each year.

The bill includes the "Dream Act" amnesty, the Ag JOBS for illegal farm workers, and a general amnesty. There would be almost no illegal alien left out of this amnesty if Sen. Menendez gets his way. Guess which party these new potential citizens would vote for?

UPDATE ON ARIZONA'S IMMIGRATION LAW

Federal Judge Susan Bolton tossed much of Arizona's landmark bill 1070, however some important parts went into effect. The ban on sanctuary cities, the right of residents to sue officials that adopt policies to prevent enforcement, and making it a crime to block traffic while stopping to pick up illegal alien dayworkers all survived. Governor Brewer has vowed to appeal Judge Bolton's ruling on the other issues.

Governor Brewer also appealed Mexico's filing of a friend of the court in the Obama administration's suit against Arizona. This attempt failed and Mexico has been allowed again to meddle in our country's business.

Karen England Speaks On Parent-Friendly School Policies at November Meeting

Karen England, Executive Director of the Capitol Resource Institute, gave a very interesting presentation at the November 17th monthly meeting on how to enact parent-friendly policies in the California public school system. She detailed numerous examples of how she and her organization were able to prevail in reversing various school board policies that directly conflicted with the rights of parents. Some of these policies included minors being able to sign themselves out of school to seek confidential medical treatment without parental knowledge, mandatory instruction for K-5 levels in bigotry, homophobia and gay families, and the ever-increasing incidence of Islam as part of the curriculum. Ms. England gave many useful pointers to the group on how to successfully deal with school boards when issues such as these arise.

At the end of Karen's presentation, Larry Pegram of the Values Advocacy Council announced he and the VAC were forging a partnership with Karen and her organization to further the cause of enacting parent-friendly policies at the school board level.


