
May 12, 2012 - Liberty Celebration

One Win for Marriage in California

This is a step is the right direction. We won a battle, but the war is not over yet.

The case, *Perry v. Brown*, is really about the constitutionality of Proposition 8, California's constitutional marriage amendment defining marriage as the union between one man and one woman. Californians voted in 2008 to protect the traditional definition of marriage. Having lost at the ballot box, gay rights activists took the battle to court to challenge the constitutionality of this measure. The political elite in the state decided to betray their own constituents and actively oppose the voters in court. California's own attorney general not only refused to defend the validity of Proposition 8, he actually argued in the state's brief that the measure was unconstitutional.

Gay rights activists thought they had devised a great scheme. They thought that there was no one to defend the law, but the official supporters of Prop 8 intervened in the case to defend the voters and make the case for the constitutionality of the measure.

The gay rights activists objected to the intervention in court. They depend on the "vision" of activist judges who can see the need to do this because "it is the right thing to do," regardless of what the law says.

What the political elite want is to hold a *de facto* veto power over voters. Thankfully, the California Supreme Court did not agree: "Neither the Governor, the Attorney General, nor any other executive or legislative official has the authority to veto or invalidate an initiative measure that has been approved by the voters."

The California Supreme Court quickly pointed out that the question is not about marriage at all. It is about "the purpose and integrity of the initiative process itself." It is about whether we are to be governed by "we the people," or by the political elite; as the same-sex "marriage" advocates seem to want.

The court explains that a case like this one is the worst possible example of the abuse of power that same-sex marriage proponents seek:

Thus, in an instance - like that identified in the question submitted by the Ninth Circuit - in which the public officials have totally declined to defend the initiative's validity at all, we conclude that, in light of the nature and purpose of the initiative process ... it would clearly constitute an abuse of discretion for a court to deny the official proponents of an initiative the opportunity to participate as formal parties in the proceeding ... in order to assert the people's and hence the state's interest in the validity of the measure and to appeal a judgment invalidating the measure.

It is a comprehensive blueprint of action to be taken globally, nationally and locally by organizations of the UN, governments, and major groups in every area in which humans directly affect the environment. It is assumed that people are not good stewards of their land and the government will do a better job if they are in control. Individual rights in general are to give way to the needs of communities as determined by the governing body. U.N. Our speaker for the Liberty Celebration is Sheriff Richard Mack, the Arizona Sheriff who dared to bring a suit against the Clinton Administration.

During his tenure as Sheriff for Graham County Arizona, federal officers informed the sheriffs of the state that they would be required to enforce the so-called "Brady Bill" and run background checks at their expense under the law. In 1994, Mack and six other sheriffs from across the country challenged the constitutionality of the Brady Bill, and ultimately fought it all the way to the United States Supreme Court where they won a monumental decision for freedom.

On June 27, 1997, the Supreme Court ruled in Printz/Mack vs. USA that the Brady Bill was unconstitutional, thus restoring the 10th Amendment:

"The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution...are reserved to the States respectively or to the people."

Today, Sheriff Mack is a tireless crusader for the Bill of Rights.

Support Our Military

Overseas Coupon Program

Send your coupons to soldiers overseas! This program serves military families by assisting us to forward "manufacturer's coupons" to overseas military bases. To date, we have sent \$19,805.69 in coupons to the U.S. Navy base in Gaeta, Italy.

These bundles of coupons are placed on tables, at the PX and Commissary, or handed out for use by military members and families on base. This helps a military family save valuable dollars and stretch their budget. Please follow these four easy steps:

- 1. Clip your "manufacturer's coupons" with expiration dates that are no more than one month past their expiration date.
- 2. Please sort your coupons into "food" and "non-food" bundles and place them into Ziploc baggies.
- 3. Tally the dollar total for each bundle and mark on each baggie with a felt tipped pen.
- 4. Bring them to the next SVARW meeting and give them to Christina Sand.

Christina will add up all the tallies and send the coupons overseas.

Remember: the magic words are "manufacturer's coupon". Do not send restaurant coupons, assistance vouchers, food stamps, or any other assistance items, which generally have a personal name on them or are issued for a specific person to use. Do not send store coupons, which are only good at the store named, and cannot be used on a military base overseas.
