What are the Solutions for our Health Care Crisis? Hilary Care? Obama Care?

Our Speaker, Sally C. Pipes served as health care advisor to the Rudy Giuliani Presidential Committee. She is President and CEO of the Pacific Research Institute, a San Francisco based think tank founded in 1979. She is the author of Miracle Cure. How to Solve America's Crisis and Why Canada Isn't the Answer.



Ms. Pipes addresses national and international audiences on health care, women's issues, civil rights, and the economy. She has been interviewed on NBC's "Nightly News with Brian Williams";

CNN; "20/20," "The O'Reilly Factor," Fox News, "Your World With Neil Cavuto", "The Today Show," "Dateline," "Politically Incorrect," "The Dennis Miller Show," and other prominent programs.

Ms. Pipes writes, speaks, and gives invited testimony at the national and state levels on key health-care issues facing America. Topics include the false promise of a single-payer system as exists in Canada, pharmaceutical pricing, solving the problem of the uninsured, and strategies for consumer-driven health care. She appears in Michael Moore's movie "Sicko" and has participated in prominent debates and public forums, testified before five talk radio shows nationwide, and had 45 opeds published on health care issues in 2006.

Legislation Continued:

Marriage Protection Act

Petition forms for the **California Marriage Protection Act** which will amend our State Constitution to place the definition of marriage as between a man and a woman, were distributed at our last meeting. This Constitutional Amendment will prevent our liberal courts and legislature from tampering with the definition of marriage in the future. Proposition 22 was passed in 2000 by over 61.4% of the voters. Thus, we MUST collect **1,000,000 signatures** between now and the first week of April. We need all of our members to sign up and collect signatures. Please pass on our petitions to your friends, neighbors, and at your church. Here are a few guidelines and tips to help you in your effort to amend the California Marriage Protection Act:

- ASK YOUR PASTOR OR WHO EVER IS IN CHARGE OF WOMEN'S MINISTRIES AT YOUR CHURCH, IF YOU CAN SET UP A TABLE AT CHURCH, FOR THE COLLECTION OF SIGNATURES.
- IN ADDITION, HAVE THE INFORMATION PUT IN THE BULLETIN AND ANOUNCED FROM THE PULPIT.
- IT WILL ALSO HELP IF YOU MAKE ATTENTION GRABBING SIGNS TO PLACE ON YOUR TABLE SO EVERYONE WILL KNOW WHY YOU ARE THERE.
- PLEASE REMEMBER, I HAVE PETITIONS AND INFORMATION ON PROP 22 THAT
 I WILL ONCE AGAIN PASS OUT AT OUR NEXT MEETING.
- MOST IMPORTANTLY, REMEMBER TO TALK TO YOUR MINISTER BEFORE THE NEXT MEETING SO YOU ARE ABLE TO BEGIN RIGHT AWAY.

This spring it is anticipated that the California Supreme Court will rule on a 4 to 3 Vote, that Proposition 22 is unconstitutional. The result of Proposition 22 was that it created an "initiative status", which keeps the legislature from changing the definition of marriage, although; it is still open to judicial interpretation and constitutional review. However, a Constitutional Amendment removes jurisdiction and keeps both the legislature and the judiciary from thwarting the will of a majority of Californians by attempting to redefine marriage. This Constitutional Amendment would not change California Law regarding "domestic partnerships". California will continue to recognize the ability of all individual couples to enter into private, enforceable agreements for mutual support and joint ownership of property.

Illegal Rebate Checks Planned

Right now the House and Senate are debating whether or not there is going to be a rebate issued to people working in our country illegally. If illegal workers file taxes under a taxpayer identification number, instead of a social security number, or if they use a stolen social security number in order to work, then a rebate check will be sent to the address on their employer's lists. What will happen when twenty-five people, or more, file taxes using the same stolen number? We don't know. What we do know, is that Social Security sends thousands of "no-match" letters to people every year. Some are due to typos, but most are due to stolen numbers. So far, the courts have not let the government pursue those that steal our Social Security numbers to obtain jobs. Our senators need to hear from us immediately. Our Message: NO TAX REBATE TO THOSE WORKING ILLEGALLY IN OUR COUNTRY! Immediately to the left of your margin is the phone numbers of our Senators, call them and let them know how ridiculous this proposal is!



Currently, there is not enough rider-ship to cover the cost of one operator. It is a system that has not been, nor will it be, producing any income from taxes. In fact, instead of contributing to incoming taxes, it has been the city's plan to consume funds from our automobile taxes, gasoline taxes, and licensing fees, instead of using that money to improve our roads.
