When you open your ballot for the February 5th Presidential Primary election, you will also be asked to vote on Propositions: **91, 92 and 93.**

Do you have any idea what these propositions are about?

And that's not all....currently there are 45 initiatives being circulated to gather qualifying signatures plus another 24 in the California Attorney General's office for signature verification. Those that qualify will be voted on in either our Primary Election on June 3rd or our General Election on November 4th.

Our January 16th guest speaker, Gloria Hom will help us sort through these propositions. Gloria Hom, a fourth generation Californian, is an economist, professor, lecturer, businesswoman, community leader and administrator. She was named "outstanding educator of America" and appointed by President Ronald Reagan in 1990 as a member of the advisory Committee of the White House Conference on Library and Information Services.

Save Our Kids!!! Referendum on SB777

SB777 signed by Governor Schwarzenegger bans any teaching or activities in schools that "promote a discriminatory bias" against homosexuals, transgenders, bisexuals, and those with gender (perceived or actual issues. References to "mom and dad" will be banned. Gender specific bathrooms will be banned.

A volunteer-only referendum campaign has never qualified for the ballot. The historic SB 777 referendum would be the first to accomplish this feat!

Don't Be Tricked by Prop 93

It's Bad for California

Perhaps even more important than voting for a presidential candidate on February 5th, is casting a "No" vote on Proposition 93. Prop 93 masquerades as a term limits initiative, when, in fact, it is the opposite. It will loosen California's term limits law for incumbent legislators, enabling them to serve 12 years in either the Senate or Assembly. In effect, the maximum Assembly term will be increased from 6 years to 12 years and the maximum Senate term from 8 years to 12 years. Does that sound like stricter term limits to you?

The reality is that Assembly Speaker Fabian Nuñez and Senate President Don Perata rail-roaded this onto the February 5th ballot for their own self interest. If Prop 93 were to pass on February 5th, both Nunez and Perata would be able to run for re-election in June. Otherwise, they will be termed out this year and they will be out of a job. And they aren't the only incumbents that stand to benefit from Prop 93. Consider this: 40 other incumbents will be able to extend their terms under this sham of legislation. 60% of the Senate would be able to serve up to 18 years! This is not what California voters had in mind when we passed term limits legislation in 1990.

But wait, there's more. Did you think that the reason for California taxpayers to pay for a third election in 2008 (the February primary) was so that we could have more impact on the presidential race? No, not at all. The real reason was so that Prop 93 could slither onto the February ballot and then, if passed, Perata, Nunez and company would be able to extend their terms by running in the already scheduled June 2008 primary. Slick, no?

If you are tired of the shenanigans that pass for government in Sacramento, vote No on Prop 93 on February 5th. California's term limits laws must be upheld to bring new legislators and new ideas to Sacramento.

California Presidential Primary

What You Need to Know

The upcoming presidential primary may take many Californians' by surprise because:

- **It's early!** We will have two primaries this year...a presidential primary on February 5th and a primary on June 3rd for local, state and federal offices.
- **It's closed.** Only registered Republicans can vote for the Republican candidates. If you know someone who votes Republican but is not registered as a Republican, let them know that they must re-register by January 22nd to vote for Republicans in the primary.
- **It's not winner take all.** Delegates to the September GOP Presidential Convention will be chosen by congressional district. It is highly likely that several of the presidential hopefuls will have California delegates pledged to them.
- **It's more than just about the presidency.** You'll be voting on Prop 93. Don't let the democrats get away with their trickery. Vote no.

If you are still undecided about who to support for president, check out www.glassbooth.org. The website enables you to weight the issues most important to you and then respond to statements relating to those issues. When you click through to the final page, you'll know which presidential candidate is the closest match to your views. You may be very surprised!


