

As you know, California is still trying to climb out of the worst recession in its history. The state has lost over 1.4 million jobs. The current unemployment rate is 12.4%, the third worst in the nation. California's economy is broad and diverse. Different regions in the state have different core economic and employment engines. Among these, high tech in Northern California; agriculture in Central California and Southern California is the most diverse in job sectors with manufacturing, wholesale trade, logistics and tourism amongst the core of its job base. So, what do businesses do when a state becomes so antibusiness that businesses can't make money?

They leave.

Where do they go?

Anywhere that treats them better.

California is now rated as the worst state in the Country to do business by corporate relocation experts. Businesses around the world look closely at this report to decide where they want to relocate and expand. Recent announcements from California-based CEO's, including those from Intel and Cisco, indicate any new expansions – potentially with thousands of good paying jobs – would go "anywhere but California." With high taxes and workers compensations costs, a nasty legal environment stacked against business, lengthy and costly construction permitting requirements and undue regulations like AB32 (The Global Warming Solutions Act) it's a wonder any businesses remain (an attempt was made to suspend AB32 this past November via Proposition 23, but opponents had it was packaged as a "Dirty Energy" proposition influenced by out-of-state oil companies, and a resounding 61% of California voters said, "NO").

Israel, previously known as the 'Land of Milk and Honey' which exported primarily oranges, is now creating and importing some of the most ingenious technological inventions that people all over the world are using. However, we've all heard about the attempts of divestment and boycotting of Israeli products? Well it's not just hummus and feta cheese from Trader Joes and Ahuva skin cream, but it's almost everything in your computer, your telephone and other electronic products. Even Kindle/Amazon was created in Herzliya, Israel. Divestment and boycotts if successful, could literally shut down much of our lifestyle as we know it. This is just one of the 'battlefields' that Israel deals with on a daily basis.



Having recently spent almost a month in Israel, where I surreptitiously met Pastor John Hagee when I was leaving the Knesset (Israel Parliament), visited the new Israel Museum in Jerusalem, had delicious food at world-class restaurants, saw the only 9/11 memorial outside of America in Jerusalem, drove a power-battered Renault car at the factory/showroom for 'A Better Place,' (Shai Agassi's 'invention' of using a grid, power stations, and battery/gas stations so that we can dispose of our dependence on gas), attended the Israel Philharmonic, it was easy to forget the conflicts surrounding this very tiny country, as well as the conflicts WITHIN the country of about 7 million people. And that includes some of the world craziest and fastest drivers.

The exterior Arab Israeli conflict, is a consequence of Muslim conquest in 638 AD of a land that belonged to the Jews centuries earlier. Many people and languages -- Jews, Christians, Bahais, Zoroastrians were, and continue to be threatened by the 21 Arab states (with a population of 325 million), as well as the 56 majority Muslim states with a combined population of well over a billion. Israel, a democracy the size of New Jersey, is the world's only Jewish-majority state, and 20% of its population is Arab, mostly Muslim, and posing more and more of a threat everyday as they begin to align themselves with the Palestinians, forcing Israel farmers off their lands, 'buying' up abandoned properties.

Behind the scenes, the Obama Administration is hard at work pressuring Israel to surrender Judea, Samaria, and East Jerusalem to the very people behind the continuing terrorist attacks against them There was no peace when Israel surrendered Gaza to the Palestinians; it just became the latest launch pad for attacks -- even on December 27th -- . Using weapons supplied by the radical mullahs of Teheran, Hamas terrorists have fired more than two dozen rockets and mortars at Jews living in the southern part of Israel. This increased level of violence comes as the world leaders continue their assault against the safety of Israel by recognizing Palestine as an independent country! (Bolivia just became the tenth nation in the past few days to do so).

So while Israel continues to live its life, creating and inventing everything from shoes, jewelry, cosmetics, hightech, medical, and we continue to visit and tour the Holy Land, its very existence is being threatened from 'within and without.' Let us pray and hope for a miracle in 2011 not only for our great country but for our friend and ally, Israel.


