

They send care packages to our deployed military personnel.

SVARW will be collecting items at our June 20th meeting to send to the troops. Some of the items that are needed on a continuous basis include:

Snacks, Foods and Treats: individually wrapped hard candy; small packages of nuts, seeds, pretzels, cookies, chips; trail mix, energy bars, protein bars, breakfast & granola bars; powdered sweetened drink mixes, ground or instant coffee, tea bags, hot chocolate, cider mix, sugar, sweetener, coffee mate, and condiment packets

Personal, Hygiene & Toiletries: Hotel/travel sized gel deodorant, shampoo, lotion, toothpaste & mouthwash, toothbrushes, dental floss and brush ups; disposable razors, eye drops, nose drops, unscented baby wipes, wet wipes, small hand sanitizer, mach III turbo razor blades; small Kleenex packets, Q-tips (large packages are fine), anti-fungal creams, band aids, foot powder, sunscreen; DVDs, AAA and AA batteries, pens, pencils, blank greeting cards and stationary, stickers, disposable cameras, AT&T phone cards; gallon, quart, sandwich and snack sized Ziploc bags to make care packages; hand written cards and letters of encouragement for our troops.



LEGISLATION UPDATE

NATION-June 2007

HR 1063 Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act – makes it a federal crime to transport a minor across state lines to obtain an abortion for the purpose of evading a parental consent law or parental notification law in the minor's home state. ACTION: Contact your members of Congress and urge them to sponsor this bill and take steps to bring this legislation to a floor vote.

HR 1592 Local Law Enforcement Hate Crimes Prevention Act (Conyers-D MI) – prosecutes any speech against homosexuality. President Bush has promised to VETO this. ACTION: Passed the House. Contact President Bush and thank him for his promise to veto this bill.

H Con RES 40 New Bill Protects U.S. Sovereignty (V Goode, Jr. R-VA.) a resolution expressing that the U.S. "should not engage in the construction of a North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) Superhighway System or enter into a North American Union with Mexico and Canada." A globalist scenario is working largely behind the scenes to unite the countries of North America. ACTION: Please contact your U.S. representative and senators, letting them know you support H. Con. Res 40. Capitol switchboard (202) 224–3121. This is sitting in limbo make a call so they do not let this die.

A-Plus Act of 2007 will allow school administrators and teachers to better serve their students by allowing them to focus on educational opportunities rather than bureaucratic requirements. **ACTION:** *Call your Representative and Senators an urge them to cosponsor and support the A-Plus Act of 2007.*

HR 1074 Ryan-DeLauro Bill - has been reintroduced in Congress. This bill is lauded as a way to prevent unwanted pregnancies. The reality of this bill is to double the funding for Title X, which provides money to organizations like Planned Parenthood. **ACTION:** Ask your Congressman to oppose the Ryan-DeLauro bill. *This bill is in the Ways and Means*.

HR 1246 Military Readiness Enhancement Act of 2007 repeals the current "Don't Ask Don't Tell" policy. Action: Ask your representative to oppose HR1246. In Subcommittee for Military Personnel.

S.1173 Freedom of Choice Act (Boxer) codifies a right to "legalized" abortion. By its actual language, the bill would invalidate any "statute, ordinance, regulation, administrative order, decision, policy, practice, or other action" of any federal, state, or local government or governmental official (or any person acting under government authority) that would "deny or interfere with" a woman's so-called right to abortion. **ACTION:** Contact Senators and Representatives; urge them to oppose. Phone 202-224-3121.

HR 1999 – provides \$5Mil in 2008 and \$10Mil each year thereafter of taxpayer dollars to National Council of La Raza to help economically-disadvantaged Hispanics with housing. La Raza's slogan is "for the race (Hispanics), everything; for others, nothing." The NCLR already receives megabucks from such corporations as Verizon, Ford, etc. **ACTION:** Voice your opinion to your Congressman/woman.

STATE

AB 629 – School-Sex Education requires that all state-funded sex education programs include information on at least one contraceptive or STD risk-reducing device. **ASM Appropriation Committee. ACTION:** Contact your assembly member to oppose AB 629.

AB 675 – Tolerance Training in Schools would establish the Tolerance Education Pilot Program to promote "tolerance" in public schools as part of history/social science classes. This means that prohomosexual and other radical indoctrination groups will receive state money to help implement "tolerance training" in school. Hearing ASM Education CANCELLED. Action: Contact you assembly member to oppose AB675

AB 16 HPV Vaccine now changes the authority for determining required vaccination from the state legislature to a single state official who will rely on the recommendations of a federal panel, the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, which currently recommends the HPV vaccine for girls aged 11-12. AB16 is still a mandate and offers no opt-out notification for parents. **Appropriation Committee**. **ACTION:** Contact your assembly member to oppose AB16.

AB 708 Reproductive Health Abstinence Education - requires the State Department of Public Health to

develop and implement a program of abstinence education that will allow California to take advantage of available and much-needed federal funds. ASM Health committee. Failed passage, reconsideration granted. **ACTION:** Contact you assembly member to **support** AB 708. **Probably will die.**

AB 394 Instruction Material – requires schools districts to establish and publicize anti-discrimination and anti-harassment policies based on "actual or perceived" gender or sexual orientation on school campuses. **ACTION:** Contact your Assembly member to oppose AB394.

AB 755 – Criminalizes spanking in California, presumable under specific circumstances, is listed as Corporal Punishment. ACTION: Contact your assembly member to oppose AB 755.

AB 1278 Human Trafficking would declare that any provision of a contract that purports to allow a deduction from a person's wages for the cost of transporting that person to the United States would be void as against public policy. The bill would also prosecute human traffickers of a minor and it would increase the penalty to imprisonment in the state prison. **ACTION:** Ask your assembly member to **support** AB 1278.

SB 102 - This bill would allow one party or both parties to a registered domestic partnership to elect to change the surname by which that party wishes to be known after registration of the domestic partnership by entering the new surname in the space provided on the Declaration of Domestic Partnership form. ACTION: Ask your assembly member to oppose SB 102. Passed the Senate 37–2 with 13 republicans voting for it.

SB 288 Pupils comprehensive learning support system explicitly states that it is the responsibility of the government, not parents, to create students who are "good parents, good neighbors, good workers, and good citizens of the world." Now, instead of being institutions of learning, schools will become the nannies of children. ACTION: Ask your senator to oppose SB288.

AB 14 – Sexual Orientation, Nondiscrimination (Laird D-Santa Cruz) adds "sexual orientation" to the list of nondiscrimination criteria in business and association codes. This removes existing immunities for uncompensated officers of nonprofit corporations which restrict membership, services or benefits on the basis of "sexual orientation." **Passed to Senate. ACTION:** Contact your senator to oppose AB14.

SB 11 – Domestic Partnerships (Migden D-San Rafael) extends California's domestic partnerships to same-sex couples, to any two persons over 18 who are in an "intimate and committed relationship of mutual caring" and share a common residence. **ACTION:** Contact your state senator to oppose SB11.

SB 777 – Schools Homosexuality/Bisexuality prohibits discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation at all public and private schools. This bill requires textbooks, instructional materials and school sponsored activities to positively portray cross-dressing, sex-change operations, homosexual "marriages," and all aspects of homosexuality and bisexuality, including so called "gay history." Also bans discrimination at colleges and universities that receive or benefit from state financial assistance. Passed the Senate. ACTION: Contact your assembly member to oppose SB777. St. Capitol, Room 5016, Sac. CA 94249 is most of ours.

SB 621 – requires the districts that allow students in grades 7-12 to be released for confidential medical services without parental knowledge or consent, to provide a stand alone notice annually to parents that this policy is in place. **ACTION:** Contact your state senator to **support** SB 621.

AB 43 – Gender-Neutral Marriage - Same-sex Marriage again. This changes marriage from a civil contract between a man and a woman to a contract between two persons. AB 43 claims that Prop 22's language only relates to out-of-state marriages. **ACTION: Ask your assembly member to oppose AB 43.**

AB 374 California Compassionate Choices Act would allow terminally ill adults, who are given less than six months to live, to obtain drugs from a physician to kill themselves. One of the major concerns with AB 374 is that depressed and weakened patients will be coerced into prematurely ending their lives by ill-meaning family members. ACTION: Ask your assembly member to oppose AB 374.
