LEGISLATION UPDATE

Sexual Orientation in Business and Education Code - AB 14 adds "sexual orientation" to the list of nondiscrimination criteria in many areas of business and association codes, including athletic clubs and ALL colleges and universities. The bill restricts right of conscience and religious speech.

Same-Sex "Marriage" - AB 43 creates "marriage" between any two persons, rather than between a man and a woman as voters required under Proposition 22. *Under the state constitution the California legislature cannot arbitrarily thwart the will of the people, as this bill would do, but many are willing to try.*

Domestic Partnerships - AB 102 allows domestic partners to easily change their surnames, mimicking and undermining marriage.

Sexual Orientation in Education - AB 394 requires schools districts to establish antidiscrimination and antiharassment policies based on "actual or perceived" gender or sexual orientation. The bill also requires monitoring of compliance.

Illegal Immigration - AB 976 prohibits local governments from implementing ordinances requiring a check on immigration status or citizenship for housing and also *prohibits private property owners from making such inquiries*.

Financial Aid for Illegal Aliens - SB 1, the "California Dream Act," requires Cal State and California community colleges (as well as the University of CA system if Regents approve) to offer tuition assistance, fee waivers and financial aid to illegal aliens who attended a California high school for three or more years and graduated or attained its equivalence.

Homosexuality in the Schools - SB 777 bans any school activities, programs, or instructional materials that might be considered "biased" against homosexuality or bisexuality, *K-12*. SB 777 could stifle any speech supporting traditional values on our campuses. The bill could also have serious consequences for Christian colleges and universities, which would be required to add "sexual orientation" to their anti-discrimination policies unless they are specifically part of a "religious organization."

Internet Pornography Filters in our Public Libraries By Claudette Averill

A few months ago I mentioned to Larry Pegram (the president of Values Advocacy Council) that I I was upset because my grandson told me that the children at Dartmouth Intermediate School could walk across the street and view pornography on the computers.

I am happy to announce that at a recent City Council meeting, Pete Constant spoke of the progress they are making. They have written a policy that goes to the Rules Committee on October 3rd, then to the San Jose City Council for a vote on October 30th.

These are the things that we can do to help protect our children and grandchildren:

- 1) Attend the October 30th San Jose City Council Meeting (we need to fill all 300 seats.)
- 2) Contact your San Jose City Councilmember (and all 10 council members if time allows) to vote YES on the internet policy procedure.
- 3) FAX a letter to your San Jose City Councilmember to vote yes on the internet policy procedure (sample text will be provided in the e-mail alert).

Councilmember Nancy Pyle from district 10 is with us!

IMMIGRATION UPDATE

The battles over amnesty legislation continue in Congress. Since any action can move so quickly through Congress, please stay in touch at www.numbersusa.com. The DREAM Act amnesty legislation includes all students who allege they were here by age 16 and will attend at least two years of college, a vocational program, or serve in the military for two years. This would include their families. It is as fraud prone as the 1986 amnesty with no security or health checks required. Sen. Reed hopes to bring this legislation back in November. Also, look for the farm worker bill to be attached to a budget bill soon (H.R. 2419). It would allow about 1.5 million workers, plus families, to be amnestied.

Then there is the pending SKIL Act (S. 1083) which allows a 77 percent increase in the importation of tech workers, with increases of up to 20 percent a year if "needed" It exempts so many tech workers from the quota that it would render the H-1B current visa program useless. It might be attached to a budget bill or passed as a stand alone bill.

Why Can't We Find Good GOP Candidates?

I am often asked why we don't have great GOP candidates who can win. Well, let's see what it takes to make a great candidate.

- TIME. A candidate needs at least a year just to run a campaign for public office, and 5 years is not out of the question. They need to meet and share with the voters through meetings, paper mailings, e-mail communications, yard signs, and handouts. They need to go to community events, home coffees, fairs, festivals, door to door walks and fundraisers. The have to be ready to speak to the press and get their words out whenever possible. They may attend 6 or 7 meetings a day. Their time is not their own. How can a working family person have enough time to do this and keep a job? It takes money.
- NAME RECOGNITION. Several years in advance a candidate needs to participate and volunteer in local and state government through appointments and commissions. They need to participate in charitable events, church, and community interest groups. Business groups and citizens must see them over time and recognize their name and connect it to participation in the community. These pursuits take them away from family and work and can create a financial problem, but people vote for people they know.
- EDUCATION. Candidates need to be prepared and educated on local, state and national issues. They need to understand what their voters want and need, and they need to know what they believe about issues. They need to participate in candidate development classes so they not only understand the requirements for the office for which they are running, and they need to understand the laws and the complicated issue of campaign finance. They need to attend GOP conventions. These are time consuming and expensive.
- COMMUNICATION SKILLS. After putting together a position paper, the candidate needs to communicate those positions to the voters through speeches, mail, e-mail, media communications, flyers, and yard signs. A web site needs to be created and a web specialist hired. An assistant is needed to answer phone calls, handle mail and respond to e-mails. An experienced campaign manager must be hired to schedule meetings with funders and volunteers and to respond to people asking to meet the candidate or to have the candidate speak at their events. Speech coaches may be hired to aid in effective communication. These are all very expensive.
- AN UNDERSTANDING FAMILY. A candidate's sacrifice is a family's sacrifice!
- MONEY. Have I mentioned money? Candidates can't hold down a job and be a part of a family as well as run an expensive campaign business without money. They need financing. We have all been on the receiving side of a phone call or other communication asking us for money. Fundraising is difficult because there are so many people asking for our money. Without thousands of dollars, even a local candidate cannot run for office and unlike the Democrats, GOP candidates do not enjoy huge injections of Union money!

Candidates of honor and vision who know why they are running and what they want to accomplish when they are elected, who have name recognition, a proven track record as a winner, are able to communicate and have the ability to raise thousands of dollars are not easy to find. They must sacrifice family and career, time and money for us.

We have such a candidate in Dean Andal. Dean is running for the seat lost by Richard Pombo. I do not live in that District, but I do live in Santa Clara County and in the United States of America! Morgan Hill is in Santa Clara County and in the United States of America. Morgan Hill is the only city in Santa Clara County which is also in this District and as residents of this county and this country, it is our responsibility to get this great candidate elected to the U.S. Congress.
