# Legislation

#### **Home school Outlawed**

#### ACR 115-Restoring Home school Freedom

The California Court of Appeals rule states that home schooling without a teacher's credential is illegal. Assemblyman Joel Anderson (R-El Cajon) has introduced ACR 115 to protect parental rights and help restore home school freedom.

The resolution affirms home schooling as a quality form of education and calls on the California Supreme Court to reverse the lower court's decision, stating that it was a "misguided interpretation" of state law. The resolution also cites United States Supreme Court decisions stating that parents have a "fundamental constitutional right to direct the education and upbringing of their children." All Republican legislators, with the exception of Assemblyman Niello have asked to co-author ACR 115. Please contact his office and urge him to join his fellow lawmakers in co-authoring the resolution.

Please call your legislators and thank them for supporting parental rights and home education. You may also go to HSLDA's website that stands for Home School Legal Defense Association and sign their petition to overturn the anti-home schooling petition!

#### **National Guard Tuition Assistance Bill**

#### AB 1758-Giving Back to Those Who Protect Us

AB 1758 is by Assemblyman Chuck Devore (R-70); The California National Guard Tuition Assistance Bill would repeal AB 540 by (Firebaugh) which was passed in 2001. AB 540 gives illegal students an exemption from paying higher, out of state, tuition fees. Instead, illegal students pay tuition as though they were legal, California state residents. Repealing taxpayer funded benefits for these illegal students would provide funding for our brave National Guardsmen. California is the only state in the union that offers no educational benefits for National Guard members. The women and men of the National Guard give their lives to keep us safe here at home and abroad. Most states offer generous benefits, CA does not. Action, call your assemblyperson and tell them that you support this bill.

## SB 1066-A Proposal to Award Homosexuals, Single men and Single Women, Marital Rights!

SB 1066 proposes to take all marriage rights – some 300 spousal rights bonding together a husband and wife in the law – and award them to unmarried men and women who refuse to marry. The bill's author, lesbian state senator Carole Migden, a San Francisco Democrat, won't admit that SB1066 rewards co-habitants for not getting married. Here's what Migden told Associated Press: "Families are changing. Young people are often having children and not rushing to marry. Straight couples and families should have the same rights as gay couples and families." SB 1066 would functionally abolish marriage. If SB 1066 becomes law, young couples will go to county government offices and be asked whether they would like a marriage license or a "domestic partnership." The domestic partnership will be "easier." Why get married, if you can get all the benefits of marriage without the commitment of marriage? Don't allow the State of California to send the message that marriage isn't special and doesn't matter. SB 1066 equates fornication and cohabitation with marriage. What a terrible legacy to leave the next generation. ACTION: Call your CA state senator, CA assembly member, and Governor Schwarzenegger to oppose SB 1066.

# Second Amendment Rights

I invite the members of SVARW to join the National Rifle Association.

At the March meeting spoke on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment. I had intended to talk about hunting and how hunters are THE leading conservationists (see Nov 2007 National Geographic). However, in the light of the Supreme Court hearing oral arguments on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment for the first time in 70 years I thought it more important to address how ALL of our constitutional rights are under attack. Remember the "spanking bill" last year proposed by a single woman and the "neutering" bill proposed by a non-pet owner. A new bill proposes taking obese children away from their parents! We cannot allow these irresponsible, intrusive laws to be enacted. The Framers of the Constitution must be rolling in their graves as most of what the federal government is doing today is unconstitutional because done without constitutional authority.

The 2nd amendment "right to bear arms" may not be your first concern. It should be. Only an armed person is a citizen, a disarmed person is a subject. Criminals fear honest citizens with guns. A grandmother with a .38 Colt Cobra is more powerful than a 250 pound mugger. Since the ban on handguns in Washington D.C., crime there has tripled. You may not want a gun right now. But who is to say that the day may not come when you will want to exercise that right.

Founded in 1871 by Union veterans, Col. Wm. C. Church and Gen. George Wingate, dismayed by the lack of marksmanship shown by their troops, today the NRQ has over 3 million members and 50 million supporters. Promoting accuracy and safety, today over 6,000 participate the in annual shoot; over one million young people participate in youth programs; there are more than 10,000 NRA-certified police and security firearms instructors; and over 50,000 certified civil instructors who train about 750,000 gun owners a year.

I am 62, I've hunted since I was 4 and a half; I didn't know you could buy a turkey at the grocery store till I was in college. I know meat does not come from a plastic-wrap dispensing machine at Safeway. I appreciate what animals give up to feed and clothe us.

I invite the members of SVARW to join the National Rifle Association. We are intelligent, forward thinking, people who care what happens to our country. And what is happening is that our "rights" are being eroded by the relentless assault of the liberal left. The NRA has the moral integrity and the will to fight to defend our constitution, they work to elect conservative candidates who are not just pro-gun, but pro-constitution.
