Noted historian, author to discuss liberty, Islam, Bill of Rights

Charlie Self, known to KSFO listeners as “Dr. History,” will address SVARW on Jan. 20. His presentation, “Islam and the Bill of Rights: The future of Liberty in America and the World,” is especially timely as SVARW meetings in 2016 will be focused on the Bill of Rights. Charlie Self is an author and minister and is effective at stimulating people of all perspectives to “think deeply and act decisively.”

Self is a senior advisor for the Acton Institute for Religious Liberty in Grand Rapids, Mich. The institute is a think tank dedicated to good intentions and sound economics as well as Biblical principles integrated with free market economics. He is an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God and has served as pastor in several congregations in California, Oregon and

Washington D.C.

He earned bachelor’s and master’s degrees in history from the University of California, Santa Cruz. His

graduate studies include a doctorate in modern European history with a focus on Belgian Protestantism and studies in virtue ethics of the Holocaust and a master’s in philosophical and systematic theology, from the Graduate Theological Union

Seminary in Berkeley.



SVARW appreciates the long-standing support of Supervisor Wasserman. Prior to administering the oath of office to our incoming officers, Supervisor Wasserman provided an update on some of the ways this lone Republican on the Board of Supervisors has been able to make a positive impact on local government efficiency.

As SVARW has done every December since its founding, we featured a local charity as our speaker and focus for our Christmas meeting. This year our guest was Carol Patterson, vice president of Cityteam. Founded in San Jose in 1957, Cityteam provides a variety of life-changing programs that help people truly change their lives out of poverty, hunger and addiction. From its San Jose roots, Cityteam has grown to add locations in San Francisco, Oakland, Portland, Philadelphia and 51 countries.

Without accepting any government assistance, San Jose's Cityteam serves more than 650 hot meals a day. Carol invited members to consider volunteering one day in the preparation of the meals. Cityteam also provides safe shelters for the homeless, showers, clean clothing, youth mentorship, and long-term recovery for men, women and children. The generous guests at our luncheon donated more than \$1,700 to help Cityteam continue its local efforts.
