## **President's message**

# *Frightful tales from the voting booth*

As president of SVARW, members seem to have the expectation that I know all things political. Nothing could be further from reality. In 2010, shortly after the November election, a longtime member of our group handed me a sealed absentee ballot that was addressed to her daughter. Her daughter was out of the country and never voted. But, when this member went to the polls to vote, she noted that someone had signed in and voted as her daughter. I had the sealed absentee ballot in hand but did not have a clue as to how to press the issue of voter fraud with the Registrar of Voters.

Having been active in a number of local campaigns over the past 15 years or so, I have run across quite a few anomalies and listened to the tales of others overwhelmed with the challenges to fair elections in Santa Clara County. Here are a few of the tales:

### **Dead people on voter list**

If you have ever walked precincts and knocked on doors for a candidate, you have likely seen voters listed who are way over 100 years old. No one ever gets removed. Absentee ballots continue to arrive at the homes and who knows who is marking those ballots.

### **Rest home voters**

A favorite activity of Dems is to go and "help" with voting at rest homes. Just help the "old folks" mark the absentee ballots and bring the load to the polling location.

### **Union bus**

This is a favorite of the public employee unions. On election day, every polling location must post at specific intervals a list that identifies

who has voted so far. Campaigns use this to find out which of their supporters have not voted and make phone calls to get them to the polls. Unions bring in busloads or carloads of union members to walk in and vote as if they were the voter on record. It is very easy to do; no identification is required to vote.

### **Absentee ballot reject**

This comes in very handy for close elections. The signed back of each absentee ballot is flashed on a screen and compared to the signature on the voter registration card. Signatures questioned by the computer are reviewed by a SEIU employee of the Registrar of Voters who can easily reject any ballot from a registered Republican.

### **Disappearing ballots**

Many working on campaigns end up working on election day at polling locations, which makes it easy to dump ballots. Poll workers are tasked with transporting ballots to the Registrar of Voters office at the end of the day. In most voting districts, the preponderance of Republicans votes is easy to identify by precinct. Ballots from those more conservative precincts do not to make it to the Registrar of Voters.

And now for the 2018 election, Santa Clara County is going to be one of the test counties for all absentee voting. Yup! As I understand it right now, everyone gets an absentee ballot and has a month to either send in their ballot or bring it to one of 10 voting locations. I'm sure we will learn more.

All is not lost. President Trump is pushing an effort to clean up voter fraud. SVARW is encouraging all of our members to consider signing up to be poll workers. You get paid plus you can watch what is happening and file a grievance.

# Speaker outlines pro-life actions

SVARW’s September speaker, San Jose native Lila Rose, recounted the many ways people can actively work to protect human rights. She asked members at the Sept. 20 breakfast, “What kind of country do we want to be, one which really believes in human rights?”

She told of seeing a Planned Parenthood tote bag that advertised such services as cancer screenings, mammograms, and prenatal care. Many of their claims are misleading, according to Lila. The facts tell this story:

- In the last 10 years cancer screenings have gone down by 70 percent,
- Out of 97 Planned Parenthood clinics contacted across the country, only five said they provided prenatal care,
- Planned Parenthood is the largest abortion provider in the country,
- They perform almost one million abortions annually,
- Their expenses for abortions have increased to the level of \$1.5 million per day, over one half billion dollars per year.
- They bill for ultrasounds, which are done solely to determine what type of abortion to perform.

There are plenty of federally qualified community clinics (13,000 nationally) actually providing a much wider range of health care services for low-income women.

Lila Rose is the founder of Live Action, an organization that seeks to “expose, inspire, and activate” in the following ways:

**Expose** misinformation and falsehoods, produce videos and harness social media to show the truth behind abortion.

**Inspire** women to choose life, as a precious gift, to see a vision written in human hearts, which is to proclaim the universal truth that life is a blessing.

**Activate** people to protect the weakest in society, to value their own lives, to value the role of fathers, and to highlight stories of grown children who were not aborted,

She urged listeners to continue to fight to keep the right to life in the Republican platform.

Lila called on SVARW members to get involved in education, defending personhood, building bridges in the political sphere, and to view abortion as violence.
