June ballot news

Vote NO on Regional Measure 3

Regional Measure 3 on the June 5 ballot asks voters in the nine Bay Area counties to approve increases to Bay Area bridge tolls. The estimated \$4.45 billion collected would be used for a variety of road and transit projects throughout the Bay Area. If approved, the measure will increase tolls by \$1 beginning Jan 1, 2019, followed by a \$1 increase in January 2022 and another \$1 increase in January 2025.

The SVARW board recommends a NO vote on this measure.

Having BART extended to San Jose sounds appealing, and a line from Fremont to San Jose is sixth on the list, but don't get hoodwinked. Here's why SVARW recommends NO on RM-3:

1. It's a regional measure, handing over a lot of money to an entity that doesn't align with and is not accountable to any recognizable government body, such as a city or county. Instead, it's accountable only to appointed representatives with no means to bring it back under voter control. Only a couple of the 35 projects listed even cross a city line, much less a county line.
2. We're offered no information on how they plan to deal with inevitable cost overruns. Do they hold off on projects until enough tolls are collected or do they float more bonds that our kids will have to pay off? Or do they come for a hand-

out from the state? Speaking of overruns, the Metropolitan Transit Commission, slated to be in charge of this monster, already has a long history of losing giant sums of our money in derivative schemes and real estate boondoggles. Not a frugal bunch — why did they need headquarters in San Francisco instead of Oakland or Antioch?

3. No stopgaps are given to keep the money from being misdirected. What happens when another "sustainable development" brainstorm arises? Will it bump our BART to San Jose line? And there's no mention of completing the BART loop allowing us to hop on at Diridon Station and head directly to Union Square.

We can do better. Vote NO on Regional Measure 3!

May 23: Karen England

Karen England, the executive director for the Capitol Resource Institute in Sacramento, will be SVARW's guest speaker on May 23. The institute is a watchdog on the state legislature and works to educate and strengthen families through legislation.

State GOP fails candidates, voters

Steve Frank says that the Republican party is dead. If the current trend continues, registered Republicans in California soon will be the third place party, behind Democrats and “decline to state” voters. In some cases, Republicans are running as decline to state candidates in order to have a chance at winning in a state that overwhelmingly elects Democrats.

The statewide party doesn’t do the basics of voter registration and get out the vote efforts that should be the most important functions of a political party, he said.

Frank, longtime Republican activist, columnist and frequent radio commentator, bluntly told the SVARW crowd on March 28 about the death of the Republican party.

“In 2016, Donald Trump won the presidency in spite of the Republican

party.” Trump represented the people of the party, not its establishment.

But the party’s death doesn’t mean that SVARW and similar groups should abandon efforts to elect conservative candidates. Frank said there are groups all over the state that advance conservative values without assistance from the state Republican party.

He urged SVARW to start developing and training candidates now for the 2020 elections.

“It takes planning. We should be looking for candidates now; we should be looking for them and training developing them,” he said.

“People in city council races win not because of great conservative theories but because they know how to fill potholes,” he said. Taking on the right issues can advance conservatism, even in California.

Transplanted Brit navigates Silicon Valley’s progressive waters

Fox News host Steve Hilton was astonished to discover the pervasive liberal attitude in the local tech world. Hilton moved with his wife to the Bay Area from the United Kingdom six years ago. Last year he began hosting a Fox News show, “The Next Revolution,” which airs Sundays at 6 and 9 p.m.

Hilton spoke at the March meeting of the South Peninsula Area Republican Coalition about the culture-shock he and his wife have experienced since moving

to California. They both have backgrounds working in conservative circles in the UK.

“We’d heard that Silicon Valley was a pretty liberal place, but we were completely unprepared for the incomprehension of our new friends and colleagues when you start articulating conservative positions,” he said.

He hears people talk all the time about openness, tolerance and diversity, but they are distinctly intolerant of different political views.

Hilton suggested that conservative tech workers could ask their companies to include diversity of political views the same way they promote other kinds of diversity.

He sees a populist revolt taking place, represented by Brexit and the election of President Trump. He urges conservatives to harness that energy to bring about positive change.
