Legislative update

Regional planning efforts threaten our freedoms

It's my pleasure to provide you with this first legislative update for the Silicon Valley Association of Republican Women. Both our state legislators in Sacramento and our federal legislators in Washington's District of Columbia have been busy passing laws that may have profound impacts on your life. It seems appropriate that a first report include an overview of our government and legislation.

As you likely know, both our federal and state levels of government operate as three branches, set up as a checks and balances system of power under our U.S. and state constitutions. For both levels of government (federal and state), the legislative branch makes the laws, the executive branch implements those laws and the judicial branch upholds those laws.

The legislative branch of the United States federal government is the United States Congress composed of two parts: the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives. Each state has two U.S. Senators and at least one U.S. Representative, apportioned based on population from the 2010 United States Census. A census is taken every 10 years to keep representative apportionment up-to-date with changing population.

Our 100 U.S. Senators and 435 U.S. Representatives from the 50 United States make up the 113th United States Congress now in session. These elected representatives serve their constituents based on the results of the 2012 Senate elections and the 2012 House elections. Originally meeting in Washington, D.C. on January 3, 2013, the 113th Congress is scheduled to end on January 3, 2015.

Plan Bay Area

Because of the profound impact regional planning and sustainable development may have on us, I have focused on bills such as AB3, SB375 and the Joint Powers Act (JPA), which were passed in previous legislative sessions and proposed legislation that support AB32 and SB375.

We are beginning to see the impact of these climate change laws in our county and cities. Plan Bay Area, a regional sustainable community strategy related to the implementation of AB32 and SB375, is one of several regional initiatives threatening our freedom of choice, our private property and our representative form of government.

The Joint Policy Committee (JPC/JPA) is implementing these regional initiatives outside of the awareness of the general public. Because board members of the JPC/JPA are not elected specifically to that board, they are unaccountable to the public. There is no way for the public to address abuse of this hybrid government through the usual political processes of elected representatives recall, initiatives or referendum.
