Initiative would repeal taxes

Gas tax hits state’s motorists hard

SVARW member Wendy Brukwinski researched the new tax, its effects on Californians and the effort to repeal the law.

On Nov. 1, California motorists were hit with an increase in gas taxes. An initiative to repeal the new tax is in the works, however backers have not yet been able to begin circulating petitions to get it on the ballot for 2018. When petitions become available, SVARW members are encouraged to circulate and sign them.

Background

The state legislature passed SB 1 on April 7, and Gov. Jerry Brown signed it into law on April 28. The bill was sponsored by State Senator Jim Beall, a Democrat who represents Senate District 15, comprised of much of Santa Clara County. The bill is intended to raise \$5.2 billion annually for road and bridge repairs and improvements to mass transit.

Fiscal Impact: The law increased the gas excise tax by 12 cents to 30 cents a gallon (plus inflation adjustments). Deisel tax increased 20 cents to 36 cents a gallon. Additionally, vehicle registration fees were raised, and a \$100 annual fee added for zero-emission vehicles. By July 2019, motorists will be paying taxes and fees of 58.3 cents per gallon, broken down as follows:

- 47.3 cents in primary and secondary excise taxes
- 2 cents on the underground storage tank fee
- 9 cents on the sales tax

Vehicle registration fees will increase by \$25 to \$175 annually. All these

increases will cost a typical family an extra \$300 to \$600 more a year.


In May, State Assemblyman Travis Allen (R-Huntington Beach) filed an initiative to repeal the new gas tax and registration fees. Once the initiative gets an acceptable title and summary, petitions will be created and start circulating around the state.

To qualify for the ballot, 365,880 signatures need to be gathered within 180 days. Signatures need to be certified at least 131 days before the 2018 general election, scheduled for Nov. 6. Electronic signatures not allowed.

How to get involved

Follow the progress of the initiative at nocagastax.com. When petitions become available, begin circulating them to eligible voters.

In case you missed it: October meeting

'Antifa' equals socialism, communism

Protesters calling themselves "anti-fascists" are actually socialists and communists, author Neil Mammen told the audience during SVARW's October breakfast meeting.

"There has never been a fascist who wasn't a socialist," Mammen said, giving as examples Adolf Hitler, Iraq's Saddam Hussein, Libya's Muammar Ghaddafi, Uganda's Idi Amin and Benito Mussolini. They stay in power by promising benefits (food, housing, health care) to the masses.

Mammen expressed concern about police chiefs across the nation who appear to be failing to protect people from those protesters.

"When the police, the people you hire to protect you, decide to play favorites, they're not working for you. If a police department fails to provide protection to any citizen of whatever

stripe and that citizen has their rights violated as a result, the police department should be taken to court for civil rights violations," he said.

America's police chiefs need to protect everyone's rights, he said.

"You want to stop liberty? That's when you get the government to not uphold the law," Mammen added. "What's the difference between having a police force that does not uphold the laws and anarchy? Or worse, having a police force that enforces only the laws they want to enforce and an oligarchy, where the elites decide what the laws are. As Black Lives Matter showed us, the police are going to be some of the first to be vilified."

He concluded by saying that the only way to save the republic is to teach the young generation the principles on which America is based, principles which include Biblical values and liberty.
