Title	Description	Reco	Rationale
Prop 1	Issues \$4 billion in bonds for housing programs and veterans' home loans	NO	Government should NOT be in the real estate business - get rid of regulations that restrict building.
Prop 2	Authorizes state to use revenue from millionaire's tax for \$2 billion in bonds for homelessness prevention housing	NO	This money is for mental health issues, not housing.
Prop 3	Issues \$8.877 billion in bonds for water-related infrastructure and environmental projects	NO	Without one penny toward water storage, adds fifty pages of special interest projects to the \$11B you've already given them.
Prop 4	Issues \$1.5 billion in bonds for children's hospitals	NO	Do we want the state building hospitals instead of private medical entities?
Prop 5	Revises process for homebuyers who are age 55 or older or severely disabled to transfer their tax assessments	YES	Looks like win/win for both folks wishing to downsize and the state looking for more property tax revenue.
Prop 6	Repeals 2017's fuel tax and vehicle fee increases and requires public vote on future increases	YES	Over \$35M raised opposing this prop from contracts & unions who want "public transportation" funded (read bullet train).
Prop 7	Authorizes legislature to provide for permanent daylight saving time if federal government allows	NR	It requires federal government approval, so don't hold your breath if you're for it.
Prop 8	Requires dialysis clinics to issue refunds for revenue above a certain amount	NO	Capping profit not the way to handle this - open up competition.
Prop 10	Allows local governments to regulate rent	NO	Government deciding how much to charge for rent doesn't build one single new home.
Prop 11	Allow ambulance workers to remain on-call during breaks paid	YES	Repeals overdone labor laws; if only they hadn't polluted it with additional stuff....
Prop 12	Bans sale of meat from animals confined in spaces below specific sizes	NO	We can choose not to buy products that have been raised inhumanely without government overreach.
Measure A	Santa Clara County Sales Tax Renewal	NO	If sales tax expires, saves us about \$500/yr.
Measure B	Monte Sereno Daves Avenue Property Designation	NO	State forcing multi-family housing on Monte Sereno, this church selected as the sacrificial spot, church NOT interested in selling....
Measure C	Los Altos Voter Approval for Changes to Parks, Open Space, and Public Land	YES	Requires voter approval to rezone city-owned land to be used for residential or any other use.
Measure F	Palo Alto Healthcare Cost Regulations	NO	Again, capping profits is NOT the way to handle cost - instead, enhance competition.
Measure G	Los Gatos Sales Tax	NO	Adds ~\$500/yr per household in sales tax, for potholes, street repair, enhanced police patrol....
Measure P	Mountain View Per-Employee Business Tax	NO	Per-employee business tax almost drove Amazon out of Seattle.
Measure S	San Jose Construction Contract Charter Amendment	NO	This bill gives city ability to award certain contract without formal bidding. Crony capitalism?
Measure T	San Jose Public Safety and Infrastructure Bond Issue	NO	Increases average homeowner's property taxes \$175/yr for potholes, etc....
Measure U	San Jose Council Salary Charter Amendments	NO	Let City Council explain voting for a raise instead of Salary Setting Commission that they appoint.
Measure V	San Jose Housing Bond Issue	NO	Puts the city in the housing business without addressing regulatory hurdles.
