| Prop 1    | <b>State of California</b> Alters State Constitution to legalize abortion with no limits.  | NO   | Current CA law allows abortion throughout 1st trimester and thereafter if mother's life is threatened. This proposed constitutional amendment makes abortion an unlimited "right". New legislation awaits Newsom's endorsement allowing abortion throughout perinatal period (birth+28 days). A child born with Downs, cleft palate, or red hair can be "aborted". |
| Prop 26   | <b>State of California</b> Legalizes more types of betting.                                | NO   | Sponsored by wealthy gaming tribes, but why confine it to tribal lands and racetracks instead of opening it to all gaming entities?  |
| Prop 27   | <b>State of California</b> Legalizes online sports betting.                                | NO   | In the land of the startup, why can online gaming only be run only by large gaming companies, and why does the bill require partnering with tribes? Also creates new unaccountable CA DOJ department to regulate, etc.   |
| Prop 28   | <b>State of California</b> Requires K-12 art/music education funds.                        | NO   | Would be better to direct the money toward STEM instead of subjects that can easily lead toward more indoctrination.   |
| Prop 29   | <b>State of California</b> Requires kidney dialysis clinics to have MD, NP, or PA on-site. | NO   | If at first you don't succeed... proposition returns again. Passage of this bill would crush small dialysis clinics, thus making care even more expensive.   |
| Prop 30   | <b>State of California</b> >\$2M income tax rate increase; funds EV & wildfire programs.   | NO   | Another tax-the-rich initiative to pay for pet projects. How long before they all leave the state?   |
| Prop 31   | <b>State of California</b> Referendum against law banning flavored tobacco.                | NO   | Pretzel-wording, but NO rejects SB793; will once again allow sale of flavored tobacco products. It's already illegal to sell tobacco products to kids, why do we need the overreach to stop sales to adults?   |
| Measure A | <b>City of Morgan Hill</b> Prohibits new warehouse buildings.                              | NR   | Bans large warehouse businesses in order to maintain "small-town feel and family-friendly character" of Morgan Hill.   |
| Measure B | <b>City of Morgan Hill</b> Voters to approve lane reductions.                              | YES  | Stops further arbitrary lane closures of Monterey Road without voter approval.   |
| Measure C | <b>City of Saratoga</b> Creates term limits for City Council.                              | NR   | Coin toss, sometimes term limits clears dead wood, other times limits allow biased staffers to run amok while green officials get up to speed.   |
| Measure D | <b>City of Gilroy</b> Updates contract bidding structure.                                  | NR   | Adding experience & qualifications as selection criteria is good, but allowing Design & Build by same contractor probably isn't a great idea.  |
| Measure E | <b>Patterson Joint Unified School District</b>   | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$570 to property tax burden. Isn't attendance way down...  |
| Measure F | <b>City of Milpitas</b> Complex term limit reduction of                                    | NR   | Could they make this more complicated? Coin toss again on term limits, clearing dead wood or enabling biased staffers, but 14 years is a long time to be stuck with a bad councilperson.   |

| Measure G | <b>City of Santa Clara</b><br>Continues & codifies 5% utility tax.         | NR   | This tax continuation generates \$30M for the city annually. New CA law requires authorization by voters for these types of transfers.         |
| Measure H | <b>City of Santa Clara</b><br>Increases business & landlord taxes.         | NO   | Santa Clara is currently \$20M in the hole, this would be a get-better move. Typical that they sell it with threats of potholes & 911 outages. |
| Measure I | <b>City of San Jose</b> Adds "social justice" stuff to city charter.       | NO   | Sneaks in removal of citizenship requirement, and what are equity values & standards?  |
| Measure J | <b>Town of Los Gatos</b> Hikes business license tax rates.                 | NO   | Increase tax rates by over 100% instead of cutting staff?  |
| Measure K | <b>City of Palo Alto</b> Institutes business occupancy tax.                | NO   | Gateway tax, starts small and ramps up, ostensibly to make up for lost pandemic revenues.  |
| Measure L | <b>City of Palo Alto</b> Continues & codifies 18% natural gas utility tax. | NR   | This tax continuation generates \$7M for the city annually. New CA law requires authorization by voters for these types of transfers.          |
| Measure M | <b>Loma Prieta Joint Union School District</b>                             | NO   | Parcel tax adds \$348/yr for 8 yrs. More money for less students? Do they teach CRT here?  |
| Measure N | <b>East Side Union High School District</b>                                | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$450 to property tax burden. Why isn't this covered under normal operations?   |
| Measure O | <b>Campbell Union High School District</b>                                 | NO   | Parcel tax adds \$85/yr for 10 yrs. How much goes toward CRT? Is performance going up?   |
| Measure P | <b>Oak Grove School District</b>   | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$450 to property tax burden. Doesn't sound like capital upgrades that are typically bond purchases.                          |
| Measure R | <b>Union School District</b>   | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$300 to property tax burden. Maintenance not budgeted?   |
| Measure S | <b>Alum Rock Union School District</b>                                     | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$200 to property tax burden. Includes teacher housing. Is anyone keeping score on how much bond revenue ARUSD raises?        |
| Measure T | <b>Campbell Union School District</b>                                      | NO   | BOND ALERT! Adds \$450 to property tax burden. They just got \$72M 6 years ago...  |
